

## 1,500 mirrors hanging on the wall

The Crystal Mirror: A blend of food and entertainment for an old-world dining experience.



In the 1920's, mirror tents — literally a tent filled with mirrors — were the choice playground for those looking for dining entertainment. (Think loud, OTT performances with acrobatic acts and musicians that could offend all your senses at once.)

If such kitschy entertainment appeals to your inner tacky self, look no further than The Crystal Mirror, a four-course gourmet dining experience underneath a mirror tent.

Making its Asian debut in Singapore next month, the show runs here for six weeks before setting off to Hong Kong, Jakarta and Taipei.

To be erected at the Padang, the tent was constructed without utilising a single nail and boasts a staggering 1,500 mirrors in an Art Nouveau setting. Just imagine the number of eyes that could catch a glimpse of the piece of spinach lodged firmly in your teeth.

Two award-winning cuisine maestros, Chef Franck Mischler from France and Chef Alfred Holzfeind from Austria, will lead a team of 12 to 15 chefs to serve four courses in three and a half hours. The menu features both Viennese and Parisian influences, and is accompanied by an extensive selection of exclusive and rare wines.

Meanwhile, comedians, singers, musicians and acrobats promise to entertain while you tuck in to the sumptuous feast. They hail from all over the globe, representing well over 10 nationalities. Expect a blurring of lines between staff, performers and yourself as the eccentric wait staff schmooze and crack jokes.

Tickets to The Crystal Mirror are priced at \$159, \$210 and \$249 for Sundays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, and \$179, \$239 and \$279 on Fridays and Saturdays, respectively. Twenty-four VIP seat tickets are available each night. These are priced at \$320 per person inclusive of a cocktail reception.
