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## Crystal Mirror and dinner-theater magic in S'pore

**B**affled and amused, I wished Einstein were still alive to see it. But far from the typical seriousness of a scientist, Tim Noddy, the long-haired New Jersey-born "bubble magician" continued to stand there erasing jokes naturally with his disquieting sense of humor.

At the same time, he startled his audience by defying the laws of physics, doing supposedly "impossible" things with his "caterpillar", "love" or "yin-yang" bubbles.

Noddy was just one of the extraordinary world-class performers who stunned the audience at Crystal Mirror.

It was an exceptional gourmet and arts experience

boasting an elegant tent featuring an elaborate French art deco interior adorned with a lunch of broccolini to transport you back to the Roaring Era of the early 1920s.

Originally constructed without the use of a single nail, this arch-rectangular masterpiece consists of more than 2,000 parts from the stained glass windows, to the wooden floorboards and velvet curtains.

Stupendous coordination was also shown by Russian hula hoop lady Irina Galagan, who swung her body gracefully and simultaneously had five hula hoop rings swinging beautifully, "wrapping" her slim, slender body.

As if that were not enough to make the audience hold its breath, later on Wanda and Jean Pierre Pissoneau, which premiered March 9 for a limited run.

Setting with hundreds of other guests one evening the other week, I was constantly fascinated by the endlessly unusual, yet outstanding performances of the talented cast from numerous nations.

thrills continued. A pleasant surprise came suddenly when the tablecloths were whipped away in a flash, to be replaced by an outburst of energy by Ukrainian eccentric twin brothers Roman and Slava. They entertained guests with hilarious tap dancing while clad in 1920s-style suits.

There was more, of course, as they were just a few of 10 astonishing performers that made the whole three-and-a-half hour event fly by so quickly.

Given the dinner-theater concept, praise must go to two-star chefs Frank Mischler from France and Alfred Hofleider from Austria.

They provided a gastronomic thrill to the tongue with their exquisite four-course haute cuisine dishes with Viennese and Persian influences.

My companion could not stop gazing about the scallop and summer truffle carpaccio served with celeriac julienne, scallop bisque and pan-fried scallops with truffles.

I had the most memorable kick from the quad shuffled with fate gras. A wine lover? Here's good news.

Complementing the continental menu, guests were also welcome to enjoy a selection of rare wines, especially imported from around the world, 100 wines and more than 40 different spirits including specialties from Asia. France was well-provided for our ultimate dining pleasure.
